STATEMENT OF EXPERIENCE AND RESEARCH

I am an applied anthropologist and an experienced and vocal critic of humanitarian aid in Haiti. The bulk of my knowledge comes from first-hand research. Thirty years of working with, living among, and studying impoverished people in developing countries—particularly Haiti, but also the Dominican Republic, Grenada, Mexico, Kenya, Democratic Republic of Congo, and Afghanistan-have given me deep insight into the behavioral and belief systems of vulnerable populations as well as the successes and failures of humanitarian aid. I have detailed my findings in 63 major reports (complete with presentations), 197 white pages and blogs, and three books. One book, Travesty in Haiti, Travesty' was for 10 years required reading for all US State Department employees assigned to Haiti. Using Cultural Consensus Theory, I developed innovative methodologies for conducting social surveys and maintaining statistically reliable networks of local informants (see NOKLINS and FREQ-LISTING), I pioneered highly graphic mapping techniques to describe, present, and archive ethnographic research findings in a way that overcomes the inertia of the boring and seldom read development report, one that is gripping and intuitive to both literature researchers and non-literate beneficiaries of aid programs (MEVMS, GARS, MIEM, Science and Art, Resiklaj Digital). I have also elaborated on techniques to estimate unknown populations (such as victims of sexual assault (see Scaling up), adopted from pioneering field methodologies of H Russel Bernard, one of my doctoral committee members and mentors. I founded what is arguably the most productive and transparent international research company working in Haiti (see SOCIODIG, Schwartz Research Group, and ResearcgGate), and I am cofounder of the major repository for Haiti development reports and focus groups (EKOHAITI). I have produced a wealth of original research, including more than 40,000 tried-and-true Kreyol/English/French questions developed and vetted in collaboration with Haitian research teams, and programmed into ODK questionnaires, 139 databases from surveys ranging from 250 to over 5,000 respondents, and an archive of more than 200 focus groups with Haitian informants that are fully transcribed into Haitian Creole and English translated. Respondents include individuals ranging from gang leaders to street children, to orphans, to victims of sexual assault to members of the LBGQT community in Haiti, to police chiefs, to peasant farmers to market women (see for a sample of those already published).
